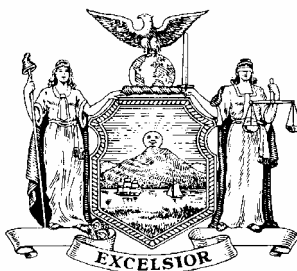

OVERVIEW OF ARRA

1. FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR CWSRF

On February 17, 2009, President Obama signed into law the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). The primary purpose of the statute is to stimulate the economy and retain or create jobs through tax relief and infrastructure investment. The Clean Water State Revolving Funds (CWSRF) received an additional Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2009 appropriation of \$4,000,000,000. For New York State (NYS), the CWSRF, as administered by the Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC), will receive an additional appropriation of approximately \$432,000,000.

ARRA requires, in part, that:

- ARRA funds be committed to projects that are ready to start construction by February 16, 2010;
- no less than 50% of the ARRA funds be provided as additional subsidization in the form of grants, principal forgiveness, or negative interest loans;
- 20% of the ARRA funds be provided for projects to address green wet weather or stormwater infrastructure, energy efficiency, water efficiency improvements, or environmentally innovative activities;
- preference be given to projects that can start expeditiously with the goal of 50% of the ARRA funds supporting projects that can be initiated within 120 days;
- if the projects funded with ARRA funds are not under construction or under contract by February 16, 2010, EPA is to withdraw the funds from NYS and reallocate ARRA funds to other states;
- States give priority to projects that are ready to proceed to construction regardless of their ranking on the Annual Project Priority List already established for FFY 2009; and
- Certain new program requirements apply to all projects, including Buy American Iron, Steel and Manufactured Goods, Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE) including Minority and Women's Business Enterprises (MWBE), various reporting requirements and Davis-Bacon prevailing wage requirements.

2. EFC IMPLEMENTATION OF ARRA

The CWSRF FFY 2009 Intended Use Plan (IUP) is being amended to identify the programmatic changes to the NYS CWSRF to reflect use of ARRA funds. This IUP Amendment presents the criteria for selection of projects to receive ARRA funds, as well as the conditions recipients of ARRA funds will be required to meet. Once the financing agreement between the recipient and EFC has been executed, the ARRA financed project will be posted on the EFC website (www.nysefc.org/recovery).

With the exception of the projects funded through the Green Innovation Grants Program (see page 5), ARRA funds will be used to finance projects on the final amended CWSRF 2009 IUP Annual Project Priority Lists that meet the criteria established for use of both ARRA and 2009 program funds. EFC will give priority to projects that EFC determines are ready to proceed to

construction in accordance with the timeframes established by ARRA. Applicants will be required to demonstrate compliance with this objective by having all construction contracts executed by January 1, 2010. EFC will give the greatest priority to projects listed on the Annual Project Priority List that EFC determines are able to initiate construction by June 16, 2009, 120 days following enactment of ARRA.

This IUP amendment is part of the NYS application for the ARRA CWSRF capitalization grant.

RECIPIENT RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER ARRA

ARRA imposes new requirements for projects that receive ARRA funds. The Project Financing Agreement (PFA) will require compliance with the following items as conditions of the EFC financing:

- American Iron, Steel, and Manufactured Goods – Plans and specifications must require iron, steel, and manufactured goods be produced in the United States unless a waiver is granted by EPA or such compliance is inconsistent with international trade agreements.
- Davis-Bacon Act - Prevailing wage rates.
- Federal Crosscutter Compliance - All applicants must comply with all applicable requirements of “cross-cutting” federal authorities for funds authorized under ARRA.
- Required of all recipients of ARRA funds:
 - Comprehensive project schedule through construction completion;
 - Provision of weekly reports of the status of their project schedule; and
 - Certification to EFC by January 1, 2010 that all construction contracts have been executed.
- Various reporting requirements:
 - The percent of construction completion at the end of each calendar quarter, reported within 5 business days of the end of the quarter.
 - Jobs created or retained.
 - Notice of award of contract for each contract.
- Federal Single Audit Act – Each non-Federal entity that expends a total amount of Federal financial assistance equal to or in excess of \$500,000 in any fiscal year of such non-Federal entity shall have either a single audit or a program-specific audit made for such fiscal year in accordance with the requirements of the Federal Single Audit Act and its Amendments.

Recipients who do not meet these conditions may face several remedies as set forth in the PFA including, without limitation, a change in the interest rate of funds (from interest-free to short-term market rate), loss of any additional subsidization (forgiveness of principal or grant), and the recoupment of all funds advanced.

APPLICATION DEADLINES

To be qualified to receive ARRA funds, a project must be listed on the Amended Annual CWSRF Project Priority List for CWSRF Financing and submit an application for financing to EFC. The deadline for submitting financing applications for CWSRF short-term and long-term subsidized financing was **March 2, 2009** for projects above the Contingency Lines in Categories A and B, and for projects in Category D on the 2009 Final IUP Annual List, as published in September 2008. There was a subsequent deadline of **April 3, 2009** for submitting applications for CWSRF subsidized financing for projects on the amended IUP Annual List who had not already submitted applications. We will consider applications for subsidized funds received after April 3, 2009 for projects on the amended Annual List to the extent that sufficient funds are available. There are no application deadlines for projects seeking unsubsidized Short-Term Market Rate Financing or Bond Guarantee Financing only.

REVISED APPLICATION FORMS

In January 2009, we revised the CWSRF financing application package, which is available for applicants to use who have not yet submitted an application. The streamlined application should be easier to complete and is available by calling EFC at 800-882-9721 or on the EFC website at www.nysefc.org (click on “Programs”, then “Clean Water State Revolving Fund”, then “Application Process”). We will continue to accept applications submitted utilizing earlier forms.

CWSRF PROGRAM CHANGES FOR ARRA

RATIONALE FOR PROJECT SELECTION FOR ARRA FUNDS

To be qualified to receive ARRA funds, a project must be listed on the amended Annual CWSRF Project Priority List (attached). EFC will give priority to ARRA projects that are ready to proceed to construction regardless of their ranking on the amended Annual List. We will give preference to projects that have all construction contracts executed as soon as possible but no later than by January 1, 2010. EFC will give the greatest priority to projects listed on the amended Annual List that EFC determines are able to initiate construction by June 16, 2009, which is 120 days following enactment of ARRA.

With the exception of the projects funded through the Green Innovation Grants Program (as described below), we will select projects for use of ARRA funds according to the following criteria:

- The ability to execute all construction contracts as expeditiously as possible, but in no event later than January 1, 2010; and
- The ability to meet all applicable program requirements.

EFC will post projects identified to receive ARRA funds on the EFC website (www.nysefc.org/recovery) as each financing agreement is executed.

EFC will require all recipients of ARRA funds to:

- Commit to a pre-construction project schedule as a condition of their financing agreement for ARRA funds;
- Provide weekly reports of the status of their pre-construction schedule; and
- Certify to EFC by January 1, 2010 that all construction contracts have been executed.

If the contracts execution certification required by January 1, 2010 is not received, EFC will consider reallocating the ARRA funds to another project that can meet the February 16, 2010 requirement. This may result in the loss of our commitment to provide subsidized financing as well as any principal forgiveness or grant, as set forth in the PFA. EFC will maintain a list of projects that qualify for ARRA funds for any such reallocation.

SHORT-TERM AND LONG-TERM GOALS FOR ARRA

EFC is committed to utilizing ARRA funds to help stimulate the economy and to create or retain jobs in NYS. In the near term, EFC will identify projects that can help achieve ARRA's goal of commencing construction activity within 120 days of enactment. The long term goal is to commit all ARRA funds to projects that will be under contract for construction by February 16, 2010. Achieving both of these goals will promote economic stimulation envisioned by ARRA.

ADDITIONAL SUBSIDIZATION THROUGH ARRA

ARRA requires that no less than 50% of the appropriated funds be provided in the form of additional subsidization in the form of grants, principal forgiveness, or negative interest loans. For projects not subject to EFC's Hardship Policy (discussed below), EFC intends to forgive a minimum of 50% of the principal amount of debt for each selected project, or the portion thereof, that qualifies for ARRA funds, subject to availability of funds. Principal forgiveness may be less than 50% if the project is co-funded from other funding sources, such as USDA-Rural Development.

For projects not subject to EFC's Hardship Policy and which EFC determines to be qualified for available ARRA funds may have access to up to 100% of the total estimated project financial needs for up to 3 years on an interest-free basis. Projects may receive a combination of 2009 program CWSRF funds, ARRA funds, and other funds subject to eligibility requirements and availability. The combination will be determined by EFC in consultation with the applicant. Within 3 years of closing on short term financing, the recipient will need to repay or convert its financing to an EFC long term financing. The additional subsidization through ARRA in the form of forgiveness of principal will be set forth in the PFA. Each recipient of ARRA funds will be subject to strict reporting and construction requirements. Recipients who do not meet these requirements may face several remedies as set forth in the PFA including, without limitation, a change in the interest rate of funds (from interest-free to short-term market rate), loss of any additional subsidization (forgiveness of principal or grant), and the recoupment of all funds advanced.

ARRA HARDSHIP POLICY

Applicants who qualify for financial assistance according to EFC's Hardship Policy as well as ARRA funds are eligible to receive principal forgiveness in a range from a minimum of 50% to a maximum of 80% or to a cap of \$4,000,000 per project unless the 50% minimum is not met, subject to availability of funds. The determination of the level of principal forgiveness provided will be based on the availability of funds with the goal of bringing the estimated first year sewer service charge down to the Target Service Charge. Principal forgiveness may be less than 50% if the project is co-funded from other funding sources, such as USDA-Rural Development. Projects may receive a combination of 2009 program CWSRF funds, ARRA funds, and other funds subject to eligibility requirements and availability. We will determine the combination in consultation with the applicant.

The draft of this IUP Amendment called for the maximum total cost of a hardship project eligible for ARRA funds to be increased from \$14 million to \$20 million. This change will not occur. The 50% minimum level of principal forgiveness is more consumptive of available ARRA funds than the level proposed in the draft IUP Amendment. Therefore, the maximum total cost of a project eligible for reduced interest rate financing due to financial hardship remains at \$14 million.

GREEN PROJECT RESERVE (GPR)

ARRA requires 20% of funds, or approximately \$86.5 million (i.e.- the GPR), be utilized for green projects to the extent that eligible applications are received. EFC will provide these funds three different ways as provided below. The actual amount of ARRA funds allocated to each will be dependent upon the demand. EFC expects there will be sufficient demand from these three methods to utilize the entire GPR for green projects or green portions of projects.

• **GREEN INNOVATION GRANTS PROGRAM (GIGP)**

EFC will be accepting applications for projects addressing stormwater and wet weather issues through the use of green infrastructure, projects that promote energy efficiency, water efficiency or that utilize innovative approaches to managing water resources. To be considered for GIGP funding, projects are not required to be listed on the CWSRF amended Annual Project Priority List. Application procedures, forms, guidance on project eligibility, criteria for selection, and other program requirements have been posted on the EFC website. Applications for the GIGP were required to be submitted to EFC no later than May 29, 2009. GIGP projects must meet the applicable requirements of ARRA and the CWSRF program. For projects that qualify for the GIGP, EFC will provide grants (90% grant/ 10% applicant contribution) subject to availability of funds. Depending on the availability of eligible applications for projects that meet program requirements, EFC estimates that a minimum of \$35 million of the GPR will be utilized through the GIGP. Projects funded through the GIGP will be posted on the EFC website (www.nysefc.org) as approved. Applications for projects deemed eligible for GIGP funding will be presented in a new Category G and published in an IUP amendment.

• **ENERGY EFFICIENCY PARTNERSHIP WITH NYSERDA**

EFC has established a goal that all projects receiving CWSRF financing should be efficient in their use of energy. To help achieve this goal, EFC is partnering with the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) to identify opportunities for energy efficiency at CWSRF financed facilities. The long-term goal of this effort will be to identify energy saving opportunities earlier in the planning process for new projects. By doing so, these opportunities can then be more easily incorporated into the scope of work for CWSRF financed projects.

EFC and NYSEDA will commence this effort with projects from the 2009 Annual Lists identified to receive ARRA funds. NYSEDA, through their engineering consultants, will perform an energy evaluation of the plans and specifications for these projects to identify opportunities for additional energy efficiencies and the incremental cost of their implementation. EFC and NYSEDA will offer to pay this incremental cost for these targeted projects, as funds are available. EFC and NYSEDA estimate that up to \$28 million will be available for this effort with 50% from the GPR and 50% from NYSEDA. The EFC portion of these funds will be provided as principal forgiveness in the PFA and will not affect the eligibility limits of the EFC Hardship Policy.

In subsequent years, EFC and NYSERDA intend to offer funds to communities for comprehensive energy evaluations of wastewater systems and facilities. The goal would be to identify energy efficiency opportunities earlier in the project planning process so these aspects can be incorporated into the scope of work to be financed by the CWSRF.

- **GPR FUNDING WITHIN THE 2009 CWSRF IUP**

EFC will provide GPR funds, in excess of amounts identified in the 2009 IUP, to those projects selected to receive ARRA funds for aspects of these projects addressing stormwater and wet weather issues through the use of green infrastructure, that promote energy efficiency, water efficiency or that utilize innovative approaches to managing water resources. GPR funding may be provided for incremental additions to an existing scope of work or for GPR eligible add-ons. This additional subsidization will be provided as principal forgiveness and will be in addition to the principal forgiveness provided to all projects identified as qualified for ARRA funds. This GPR funding will not affect the eligibility limits of the EFC Hardship Policy. The amount of GPR utilized will be dependent on the demand for funds through the two previously described programs.

Applicants in Category C may participate in this portion of the GPR program for current IUP listings or with stand alone, CWSRF-eligible projects. Projects not on the IUP Annual Project list will be listed in an IUP amendment at the same time as the GIGP projects.

SMART GROWTH

Financing of water quality projects that repair, maintain, or upgrade existing infrastructure and support smart growth is given higher priority. EFC is reviewing engineering reports and project listing information to identify those instances where applicants fail to demonstrate adherence to smart growth principles and are proposing to either increase capacity or extend service without adequate planning or justification.

For instance, we will require projects whose scope of work proposes to:

- Extend collector sewers into areas where less than 67% of the parcels are occupied,
- Expand design capacity for treatment or transmission above a 20 year planning period (Recommended Standards for Wastewater Facilities-10 State Standards) or 25% above current flows, or
- Extend collector sewers to an isolated hamlet without consideration of the use of decentralized treatment technologies,

demonstrate that adequate planning has been performed and adopted by the appropriate governmental body. Adequate planning for such projects should be documented by Comprehensive Plans, regional plans, infrastructure plans, or other planning documents and should be included in the engineering report as justification for the project scope of work.

REFINANCING OF PRIOR DEBT

Congress has stated as a goal that ARRA funds should be used in a manner that maximizes job creation and economic benefit. To the extent permitted under ARRA, EFC will consider segmenting or phasing projects for purposes of ARRA funding with respect to costs incurred after October 1, 2008.

REALLOTMENT

If NYS is eligible for reallocated CWSRF ARRA funds, EFC will provide certification through an IUP amendment that all funds received will be committed to ARRA qualified projects that will be under contract for construction within 120 days of reallocation. EFC will maintain a list of projects that are qualified for ARRA funds for submittal to EPA in the event of a reallocation of deobligated ARRA funds.

SOURCES AND USES

We have added the “5.3 Table B1: Estimated Sources of Funds and Financing Potential for ARRA Funds” (attached) to show the distribution of ARRA funds for the CWSRF program from the anticipated ARRA appropriation.

PROJECT PRIORITY LIST

“8.0 Appendix A: Amended Annual CWSRF Project Priority List for CWSRF Financing” (attached) includes lists of projects in Categories A, B, C & D that EFC may finance with available CWSRF and ARRA funds by September 30, 2009. We have moved three projects in Category A or B on the final 2009 IUP Annual List that subsequently qualified for financial hardship to Category D. Also, due to an administrative oversight when publishing the final IUP Annual List, we have corrected a score for one project as indicated in the revised Category B Annual List. We made some minor changes in project financing amounts that reflect documented increases in project cost estimates. We also modified some project numbers, including moving one Category B project from the Multi-year List, with no change to the projects to facilitate tracking of the use of ARRA funds. To take advantage of their hardship eligibility, three Category D projects on the final IUP Multi-Year List have been moved to the Category D Annual List. Based on the bypassing of projects that will not be seeking financing in FFY 2009, funding lines are shown on the Project Priority List.

FINANCING PROGRAMS

EFC will continue to determine interest rates and loan terms as described in the final CWSRF 2009 IUP (Sections 3.3 and 3.4) . The fees and costs of CWSRF financing are presented in the final CWSRF 2009 IUP (Sections 10.3.1 and 10.3.2).

STATEMENT OF AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE PRINCIPAL FORGIVENESS

Public Authorities Law, section 1285-j.4 provides authority for EFC to provide additional subsidization in the form of forgiveness of principal or grant.

ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS

EFC can utilize up to 4% of the allocation for administrative costs. EFC plans to use 2.75% (\$11,895,516) of the maximum 4% of the ARRA appropriation to New York State that could be used for program administrative costs. EFC will utilize the remaining 1.25% of the 4% amount for project financings.

STATE BOND ISSUANCE CHARGE

Section 10.3.1, Finance Issuance Costs, is revised to reflect changes in the State Bond Issuance Charge (SBIC) as follows:

The SBIC changes will be operable through the remainder of the 2009 IUP period.

EMERGENCY REGULATIONS

EFC and DEC are implementing emergency regulations to address the implementation of ARRA. Specifically, the regulations address additional subsidization in the forms permitted by ARRA, green infrastructure, add certain non-municipal recipients, and clarify various provisions.

FIXED PRICE CONTRACTS

To the maximum extent possible, contracts funded under ARRA shall be awarded as fixed price contracts through the use of competitive procedures.

DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (DBE)

EPA adopted a rule (40 CFR 33) to encourage the DBE participation in CWSRF financed projects, effective 5/25/08. The ARRA appropriation requires that the requirements of this rule be addressed. EFC has modified our MWBE Program to incorporate the requirements.

PUBLIC REVIEW AND COMMENT ON AMENDMENT NO. 1

A public notice on the availability of draft Amendment No. 1 and request for comments was published in the State Register and Environmental Notice Bulletin. The New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC) accepted comments on Amendment No. 1 to the FFY 2009 CWSRF IUP by mail, email, or fax until close of business **Friday, April 3, 2009**.

A comment was received from the Village of Weedsport offering updated project cost information. The project costs presented in the attached Project Priority List reflect this updated cost information.

A comment was received from Westchester County Deputy County Executive requesting that two projects be considered for receiving ARRA funds. One of the identified projects has been publicly announced as a candidate to receive ARRA funds.

A comment was received from the Acting Commissioner of the New York City Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) raising concerns regarding their share of ARRA funds.

In particular, DEP contends that “New York State may choose not to exercise the discretion provided in ARRA to use more than 50% of the New York State grant of \$432 million for additional subsidization”. As stated previously in this document, “For projects not subject to EFC’s Hardship Policy, EFC intends to forgive a minimum of 50% of the principal amount of debt for each selected project, or the portion thereof, that qualifies for ARRA funds”

In addition, DEP objects to the provision of ARRA funds for Category D, Hardship Communities. New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (6NYCRR Part 649.3) and Environmental Facilities Corporation (21NYCRR Part 2602.3)

regulations require CWSRF funds first be allocated to Category D and E projects prior to other categories receiving their allocation. New York City's allocation is included in these other categories. ARRA does not preempt compliance with existing regulations.

DEP also contends that by minimizing the number of projects receiving ARRA funds, there would be less cost for compliance with the requirements of ARRA. EFC will work with New York City to identify how their designated ARRA funds can be allocated to minimize the cost of compliance with ARRA requirements.

DEP also objects to being precluded from participating in the Green Innovations Grants Program (GIGP). The Green Project Reserve (GPR) is being allocated into three opportunities for participation, one of which is the GIGP. EFC expects that New York City will be an active participant in the two other GPR opportunities, the Energy Efficiency Partnership with NYSEDA and GPR Funding within the 2009 CWSRF IUP. EFC is prepared to work with New York City to ensure that their GPR-eligible projects will receive ARRA funds.

No other comments were received.

Type of Financial Assistance

EFC will provide ARRA funds to projects selected by EFC that meet the requirements of ARRA and CWSRF program requirements, to the extent that funds are available. Projects may receive a combination of 2009 program CWSRF funds, ARRA funds, and other funds subject to eligibility requirements and availability. The combination will be determined by EFC in consultation with the applicant. Other projects will be provided with 2009 CWSRF program funds, to the extent that funds are available.

Estimated Date of Closing

EFC will work with communities to close financings as quickly as possible to adhere to the intent and requirements of ARRA. All projects that can be reached for financing with 2009 CWSRF program funds will be closed no later than September 30, 2009.
